



What is the Definition of a Cow?


This article was printed in the September issue of the 1966 American Red Angus.

A big city school boy describes a cow something like this:

A cow is a completely automatic milk manufacturing machine. It is encased in untanned leather and mounted on four vertical, movable supports, one on each corner. The front end contains the cutting and grinding mechanism, as well as the headlights, air inlet and exhaust, a bumper and foghorn. At the rear is a dispensing apparatus and an automatic fly swatter.

The central portion houses a hydrochemical conversion plant. This consists of four fermentation and storage tanks connected in series by an intricate network of flexible plumbing. This section also contains the heating plant complete with automatic temperature controls, pumping station and main ventilation system. The waste disposal apparatus is located at the rear of this central section. In brief, the externally visible features are: two lookers, two hookers, four stand-uppers, four hanger-downers and swish-wishy.

There is a similar machine known as a bull, which should not be confused with a cow. It produces no milk, but has other interesting uses.



THE CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Well, Christmas and New Years are over and we are into January. Seems like a long time until spring. For many of us Christmas was a good time with family and/or friends. This gentleman requested "Just As I Am, Without One Plea". Not a usual request for a Christmas Carol but as the congregation sang it they realized how great a gift Jesus gave us.

The first verse goes

Just as I am, without one plea, But that Thy blood was shed for me, And Thou biddest me come to thee, O Lamb of God, I come, I come!

The baby in that manger grew up, became a sacrifice for all of us, and is the King of this world. We will all stand in front of Jesus on judgement day and the only defense we will have is if we have accepted his shed blood. If we have, we have all eternity with Jesus ahead of us.

IRS Imposter Scams



IRS imposter scams occur when someone contacts you pretending to work for the IRS. The imposter may contact you by phone, email, postal mail, or even a text message. There are two common types of scams:

• Tax collection - You receive a phone call or letter, claiming that you owe taxes. They will demand that you pay the amount immediately, usually with a prepaid debit card or wire transfer. They may even threaten to arrest you if you don't pay.

Verification - You receive an email or text message that requires you to verify your personal information. The message often includes a hyperlink phrase which reads "click here." Or, you may see a button that links you to a fraudulent form or website.

How to Report IRS Imposter Scams

Contact the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration (TIGTA) if you believe that an IRS imposter has contacted you. Report IRS imposter scams online or by calling TIGTA at 1-800-366-4484. Forward email messages that claim to be from the IRS to phishing@irs.gov.

How to Avoid IRS Imposter Scams
There are things you can do to protect yourself from an IRS imposter scam.

Do:

 Beware if someone calls claiming to be from the IRS. The IRS will always contact you by mail before calling you about unpaid taxes.

Ask the caller to provide their name, badge number, and callback number. Then call TIGTA at 1-800-366-4484 to find out if the caller is an IRS employee with a legitimate reason to contact you. If you confirm that the caller is from the IRS, call them back. Otherwise, report the scam call to TIGTA.

Become familiar with what fraudulent IRS email messages look like. Review a sample IRS phishing email.

Verify the number of the letter, form, or notice on the IRS website.

Be suspicious of threats. The IRS won't threaten to have police arrest you for not paying a bill.

Don't:

• Don't give in to demands to pay money immediately. Be especially suspicious of demands to wire money or pay with a prepaid debit card.

Don't trust the name or phone number on a caller ID display that shows "IRS." <u>Scammers often change the name</u> that shows on caller ID using a technique called spoofing.

Don't click on any links in email or text messages to verify your information.
