Please help Little House Museum preserve Stratton's history!

We are looking for any information on Stratton's hospitals during the 1950's. Do you recall hearing any stories involving The Stewart-Brown Memorial Community Hospital Association? Former Stratton residents including W. B. Hall, E. J. Dahnke, Paul Craw, Donald D. Haase, Ida Blue, Louis Stolte, E. Earl Bailey, W. A. Isaacson, Oscar E. Miller, Martha V. Grosse, William C. Dahnke, Ralph E. Jones, Mrs. Mary Isaacson, M. E. Mauel, John H. Eller, H. D. Wimer, T. W. Jones, Wayne Rath, Harry Fryar and Morten Grosse were involved in forming the organization in August of 1954.

I received a letter recently from Beverly Grosse Williams. She is the daughter of Elmer (Bud) Grosse. She sent me the incorporation papers from the State of Nebraska for the Stewart-Brown Memorial Community Hospital Association of Stratton, Nebraska". This group was filed under the Miscellaneous Incorporation on August 23, 1954.

Here are some of the statements:

The general nature of the business to be transacted by the corporation is for the purpose of providing for, erecting, owning, buying, selling, mortgaging, leasing, furnishing, operating, and managing any building, hall personal property, land or grounds for the use in whole of the general public and community of Stratton, Hitchcock County, Nebraska and for the purpose o holding property of any nature in trust for the general purposes for which this corporation is created, it, however, being expressly declared that this corporation I not organized for any business purpose of pecuniary gain or profit.

No capital stock and no dividends

Activities shall be maintained, kept and operated through payment of membership fees.

Shall exist for 75 years unless dissolved sooner

Highest amount of indebtedness of liability at one time be subject to \$250,000.00 and in no case exceed the value of the property owned by it.

Affairs to be conducted by a board of directors.

Private property of corporation members not subject to any corporate debt.

Was this a group of citizens looking ahead to the building of the hospital in 1962? Or was it to purchase the "old clinic building". Or any of the other buildings that served as a hospital.

Sadly we have to look to those of use second generation people that were here at the time and hove good memories of what was going on here. Do you remember your parents talking about any of this? If you have some knowledge about any of this please share it with some of the Little House Museum group.
