



STRATTON POOL FUNDRAISER


Thank you everyone who participated in the 50-50 raffle for the pool. \$371 was raised with \$185.50 to go to the winner.

Butter



THE CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

In the last Chaplain's Corner we talked about how the disciple Peter was changed. First, Jesus saved him, then the Holy Spirit filled him, along with the rest of the disciples, and they began to speak in other tongues. There were many Jews from other nations present because they were there to celebrate the 50th day, (Pentecost) after Passover, also the Feast of Harvest, and for the Christians fifty days after the Resurrection. Those that were there from other nations were amazed because these people, who speaking in their language, were Galileans. Galileans were known as fishermen and not well educated.

In the book of John, from chapter 14: verse 16 to chapter 16 verse 7, Jesus speaks of sending a Helper, a Comforter, the Spirit of truth that the world could not receive, but would dwell in Christians. Jesus said the Spirit would teach us all things and bring to our remembrance the things Jesus had said.

Being baptized in the Holy Spirit had given the disciples a boldness to preach the Gospel and a love for other people. They didn't want to see other people perish in Hell so they told others about the saving grace of Jesus Christ. In doing so, they, in many cases, they put their lives on the line. All of the disciples except John, were executed for preaching the gospel.

Today there is much confusion about the Baptism in the Holy Spirit. Some denominations say that isn't for today, that it was for then. Some people seem to be frightened about speaking in other tongues. It can be a message from God if there is an interpreter present. Tongues can be spoken in your private prayer closet and the Holy Spirit can interpret it for praise. It can be used for your own self edification. I personally believe that the reason there is so much confusion about the Baptism in the Holy Spirit is because Satan knows what it does for the individual Christian. The baptism fills you with a love and a joy that helps you be a soul winning Christian. As you read through the book of Acts, when people accepted Jesus as their savior, they were baptized in the Sprit.

I fully believe that we are entering into a time when we are going to need everything God has to offer us so we can fight the battle that is before us.
