## Visit To This Nebraska Store Will Take You Back to The Wild West

Nebraska's Wild West history is pretty well known, particularly in the panhandle. This is where the famous showman Buffalo Bill chose to make his home and where he hatched the idea for his Wild West Show. Today, the area still celebrates this fascinating history. This unique store and museum offers visitors a place to look into history, stock up on supplies, and even pick out some fun souvenirs

Fort Cody Trading Post is a unique family-owned business that's been delighting visitors since 1963. The first thing you'll notice when you pull into the parking lot is the larger-than-life Buffalo Bill Cody figure towering over the cars. Get close to the base to read about the fascinating man's life.

As you get a little closer, you'll get your first taste of the humorous vibe you'll encounter inside. Cowboy mannequins guard the top of the fort, and one of them can even be seen with an arrow stuck in his rear

end!

Inside, you'll see all kinds of items that you'll want to investigate, along with plenty of delightful displays and hidden surprises. Pick up a t-shirt, postcard, or other souvenir to commemorate your time at the trading post.

Browse a variety of other Nebraska-themed and Nebraska-made items, like unique jewelry... And delicious food items.

Various items from the Wild West Show and from the Wild West era in general are also on display. Check out some of the elaborate costumes used in the show.

Lots of people stop in just to see the legendary scale model of Buffalo Bill's Wild West Show. This itty-bitty replica includes more than 20,000 handmade figures crafted by husband-and-wife team Ernie and Virginia Palmquist. The display took more than 12 years to complete and today is one of the most beloved folk art displays in the country. The intricate diorama is actually animated with several moving pieces and accompanied by narration; the show runs every half-hour. Like all of the other displays in the trading post, you can see this show free of charge.

Visit the Fort Cody Trading Post at 221 Halligan Drive, North Platte, Nebraska 69101. The store is open year-round but has different hours for different seasons. Get more information on hours and some of the fun things to do and see on the Post's website.



Make-Ahead Mashed Potatoes

5 lbs Yukon Gold potatoes, cubed 2 (3 oz) pkgs cream cheese Ground black pepper to taste

½ c. milk8 oz sour cream2 tsp onion salt

Place potatoes in a large pot of lightly salted water. Bring to a boil, and cook until tender, about 15 minutes. Drain, and mash.

In a large bowl, mix mashed potatoes, cream cheese, sour cream, milk, onion salt and pepper. Transfer to a large casserole dish.

Cover, and bake for 50 minutes in preheated oven at 325° F.

# **Stopping Unwanted Calls**

Fed up with robocalls and other nuisance calls? Beyond registering your landline and cell phone numbers with the National Do Not Call Registry (1-888-382-1222 or online at www. donotcall.gov), there are a number of things you can do to substantially reduce, if not eliminate, these calls.

## Stopping Unwanted Calls on Your Landline

Ask your local phone company about custom calling features. These features can be easily activated and deactivated on your phone through quick-dial combinations known as star codes. Popular and most often free calling features include:



### Anonymous Call Rejection (\*77)

Stops your phone from ringing when callers have blocked their number from appearing on your Caller ID display.

### Selective Call Rejection (\*60)

Allows you to program your phone to block unwanted calls from numbers placed on your rejection list ("blacklist"). Callers from blocked numbers hear a short, polite message that you are not accepting calls at this time. All other calls ring through as usual.

## Selective Call Acceptance (\*64)

Allows you to limit incoming calls to a preapproved list of phone numbers from which you will accept calls ("whitelist").

Check with your phone company to understand list limits and how to manage adding or deleting calls.

Consider installing a call-blocking device. These devices come pre-loaded with a nuisance call database and permit you to block hundreds even thousands more at the touch of a button. Some devices reject all calls shown as PRIVATE, INTERNATIONAL, UNKNOWN, and showing as multiple 0's or variations of fake numbers. Some permit you to block a state, area, or international country code. These devices are available for sale nationally at major retailers and online.
