

Village of Stratton Reminders and Ordinances

We have had a lot of rain this summer and with that came a lot of growth. Many properties in town seem to have struggled to keep up with the growth of their lawns. As a reminder, Stratton Village Ordinance 91.24(B) states the following:

The owner or occupant of any lot or piece of ground within the village shall keep the lot or piece of ground and adjoining streets and alleys free of any growth of 12 inches or more in height of weeds, grasses, or worthless vegetation.

Please ensure your property is in compliance with this ordinance. Properties that are not in compliance may be subject to nuisance mowing by the Village employees. Current rates are \$50.00 per hour for the mower plus a minimum \$25.00 per hour labor charge for the first offense. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the Village Office. Thank you for your anticipated cooperation and having pride in your community!

As a reminder Village Ordinance 72.09 CURRENT REGISTRATION states:

It shall be unlawful to park or place on the highways or other public property any vehicle required to be registered by the Motor Vehicle Registration Act that is not registered in accordance with the Act.

Make sure your vehicles have current registration visible or move them to private property.

The Village would like to remind all residents that as part of our procedure to control the mosquito population and reduce the spread of harmful viruses, the Village may implement spraying insecticide treatments by ground. Decisions on treatment time and dates are determined as conditions arise, and application is dependent on a number of factors, including weather conditions. Notification of treatment is announced as soon as available. Residents in the Village limits of Stratton can subscribe to our notification list and receive an email, phone call, or text notification for adult mosquito treatments by registering at the Village Office. Although chances of experiencing any health effects from spraying are quite low, the following may help reduce possible exposure: If possible, remain inside or avoid the area whenever spraying takes place and for about 30 minutes after spraying; Close windows and doors during spraying; If you come in direct contact with the spray, wash effected areas. To help prevent the need of spraying, residents can help by eliminating standing water on their property, empty and change water in bird baths. fountains, wading pools, or potted plants, and keep swimming pool water treated and circulating.

The Village of Stratton is a customer of SWPPD to purchase and provide electric service to the town. The electrical system is owned and operated by the Village. Any communication for electrical concerns, including needed repairs, should be directed to the Village as SWPPD will not be able to assist individual residents. SWPPD has asked us to remind all residents of this as they have had an increase in unapproved contacts requesting repairs in Stratton. Thank you for your understanding in this and keeping the line of communication in place.



K-2nd grade: 1st Rachel Kollmorgen


2nd (tie) Madison and Henry Kollmorgen
