## Easter Chocolate Lasagna

#### **Oreo Crust:**

- 36 Oreo cookies
- ½ cup unsalted butter-melted

## Cream Cheese Layer:

- ½ cup unsalted butter-softened
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 8 oz cream cheese-softened
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 cup Cool Whip

## **Chocolate Pudding Layer:**


- 2 (3.9 oz.) packages chocolate instant pudding
- 2 and 3/4 cups cold milk

## Topping:

- 2 cups Cool Whip
- 1 ½ cups crushed Oreo
- Peeps bunnies, Easter egg candies...

#### Instructions

- 1. In a food processor finely crushed Oreo cookies into fine crumbs. If you don't have a food processor, place Oreo cookies into ziplock bag and crush the cookies with a rolling pin.
- 2. Using a fork to mix crushed Oreo with melted butter, then press the mixture into the bottom of 9 x 13-inch dish. Place in the fridge to firm.
- 3. Beat cream cheese, softened butter, sugar and vanilla until it's light and creamy. Stir in 1 cup Cool Whip. Spread the mixture over the crust and place in the fridge.
- 4. In a medium bowl mix chocolate instant pudding with 2 and 3/4 cups cold milk. Whisk for a few minutes until the pudding starts thickening. Spread the pudding over the cream cheese layer. Place in the fridge for 10 minutes.
- 5. Spread 2 cups Cool Whip on top and sprinkle with crushed Oreo. Refrigerate at least 4 hours before serving. Garnish with Peeps and Easter egg candies.

No branches longer than six feet in length. NO GRASS CLIPPINGS OR PLASTIC BAGS! Pick up will take place as employees are available during the following week.

The Village of Stratton is beginning the process to work with property owners in attempt to clean up properties that are in violation of Village nuisance ordinances. The program follows the ordinance as set by the Village Board. Both the ordinance and process are backed by state laws.

## The Nuisance Process:

Step 1: Initial Property Reviews and Courtesy Letters Sent

Step 2: Second Assessment

Step 3: Declared Nuisance by the Board

Step 4: Third Assessment

Step 5: Five Day Notice via certified mail


Step 6: Fourth Assessment

Step 7: Abatement

This process is taking place Village wide and is not complaint driven. The entire Village is being reviewed in an attempt to clean up and bring all properties into compliance with Village Ordinances. If you have any questions regarding any letter you receive or the items described in your letter, or wish to dispute any determinations, please contact the Village Office for clarification or to request a hearing. We want to work with property owners to resolve any nuisance issues before the issue gets brought to the Village Board for abatement procedures. The goal of the program and Village Board is NOT to abate. Communication is helpful and often extensions to complete the work are granted.

Nuisance Officers do not get out of their vehicle and only travel on public roadways and alleys and do not go on private property to take pictures. Cameras used have zoom lenses. If you are aware of any violations on your property, please take the initiative to come into compliance prior to receiving a letter. If you need assistance with clean up, contact the Village Office to be put into contact with volunteers or for access to the Village tree dump. If you would like to volunteer your time or equipment please contact Tara to be connected with those requesting assistance or no access to needed equipment.

We look forward to everyone's anticipated compliance and the rewards of having a beautiful community for current residents to enjoy and to draw future residents to the area!



#### THE CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

John chapter 14 vs 6. Jesus said to him, "I Am the way, the truth, and the life, no one comes to the Father except through Me."

Pilate, the one who condemned Jesus to death, asked "Are you a king then?" Jesus answered "You say rightly that I Am a king. For this cause I was born, and for this cause I have come into the world, that I should bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth hears My voice." And Pilate says "What is truth?" I have heard it said that Pilate could not recognize truth, even when it stood right in front of him.

I have relatives that live in retirement centers in two different cities and they tell me that many of the people in those centers refuse to seek or recognize the truth, whether it be political or spiritual, they are comfortable in being deceived.
